- - a. You are given 3 extra minutes before and after class!

 - g. The student demonstrates appropriate personal and communication skills.
 - h. The student applies appropriate research methods to agriculture, food, and natural resources topics.

- i. The student applies problem-solving, mathematical, and organizational skills in order to plan and propose supervised agricultural experience programs as well as maintain financial and logistical records.
- j. The student uses information technology tools specific to agriculture, food, and natural resource to access, manage, integrate, and create information.
- k. The student develops technical knowledge and skills related to plant systems.
- 1. The student develops technical knowledge and skills related to animal systems.
- m. The student describes the principles of food products and processing systems.
- n. The student safely performs basic power, structural and technical system skills in agricultural applications.
- o. The student explains the relationship between agriculture and safety, health, and the environment.
- 6. Grading system:
 - a. This class is graded different than other classes:
 - A. Daily grades will be based on and effort
 - B. Tests grades will be based on the effort, skill and mechanics
 - C. Participation grades will be based on your work/effort on that day.
 - b. The following formula will be use to calculate Agri-science grades:
 - 1. 50 Percent Test Grade Average
 - a. This class is a project based class and will be graded based on creativity, skill, and effort.
 - 2. 30 Percent Daily Grade Average
 - 3. 20 Percent Participation Grade Average
 - a. This will be given weekly and you will not know what day the grade is given.
